In December 2009, the American Sheep Industry Association (ASI) membership was sent a survey as part of an ongoing national effort to assist the newly formed Re-building the Sheep Inventory Committee, which is working to strengthen U.S. sheep production, and to address questions regarding product purchases to entice more companies to support industry programs. In addition, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Wildlife Services program was looking to gather information about predation and the use of livestock protection dogs.

The information in this document reflects the completed surveys that were received by the ASI office as of Jan. 11, 2010, which was the deadline. Of the 7,394 surveys that were mailed, 1,640 were entered into the survey program, which is a response rate of 22 percent. ASI thanks the membership for the strong participation in the survey.

This document does not include the answers to the open-ended questions, which will be analyzed at a later date. Rather the purpose of this document is to provide a general overview of the results.
